BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICES

Established in 1982 Patients' Welfare Association's Blood Bank, is one of the leading and well equipped blood bank in Pakistan with a daily dispatch of 300+ blood bags being the largest single outlet blood bank of the city and the only one existing in the premises of Dr. Ruth K. M. Pfau Civil Hospital Karachi that has been saving thousands of lives throughout these years. The blood bank follows the WHO protocol to ensure the provision of safe and healthy blood products by screening it for five major blood borne diseases i.e. Malaria, AIDS, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and Syphilis while employing the upgraded technology of Chemo Luminescence Immunoassay (CLIA).



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Patients' Welfare Association is a non-profit, non-political, non-government organization which has been operating in one of the largest hospitals of this mega city, Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital. For many years, PWA has been serving the under-privileged and providing them with quality and timely services free of charge. This organization, run by the students of Dow Medical College, has been catering the largest haul of poor and debilitating humans, who cannot afford optimum medical services on their own. It has overcome many obstacles over time and surpassed every hurdle it encountered. But due to lack of proper funding and resources, it is facing hard times these days. To help PWA continue its selfless journey, it requires immediate attention from generous benefactors.

THALASSEMIA SERVICES

Thalassemia, being one of the leading and the most rapidly growing disorder in the world, is the main concern of many developed countries in the world, however, developing countries are still struggling in solving this problem. In 2011, PWA brought one of the biggest revolutionary initiations in Pakistan by setting up a Thalassemia Day-care Centre, where this disease is managed absolutely free of cost. Our thalassemia services

provide the registered patients with:

- Consultation by a qualified hematologist
- Screened blood transfusions
- Iron chelation therapy and other medications
- Lab investigations

With that, awareness campaigns are also arranged every now and then to educate our people on this topic as we believe the root cause needs to

be eliminated to ensure the next, better Pakistan.

THALASSEMIA AWARENESS AND PREVENTION

Thalassemia is a disease of blood which is transferred from parents to the offsprings. It results in reduced haemoglobin synthesis which is an important component for transport of oxygen to the body organs. Thalassemia has two major types namely Alpha thalassemia and Beta Thalassemia (major beta thalassemia is a severe condition).

This disease can be diagnosed by techniques such as Hb Electrophoresis, and CBC etc.

Treatment of thalassemia usually involves regular blood transfusions. Bone marrow transplantation is a definite permanent treatment but is not commonly done in Pakistan.

Thalassemia is seen at a constant rate in the Indian Subcontinent.

It is reported in Pakistan at the rate of 5000 per year.

The main reason behind increasing cases of thalassemia is the lack of awareness about the disease.

The government should device programs for the education of general public about this problematic disease. Moreover, efficient screening programs should be initiated. All these strategies have shown promising result.

PWA has been managing Thalassemia patients and providing them with regular screened blood, Iron chelation therapy, laboratory tests and other medications free of cost. Currently 250 registered patients (with each patient's expenses being around 3-5 Lac per year) are being facilitated with the aim to improve their quality of lives by zero compromise on the standard of services rendered.
