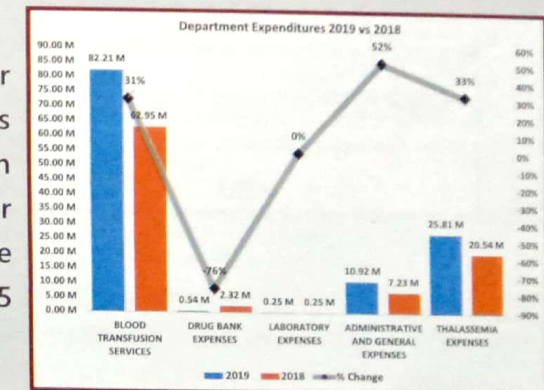
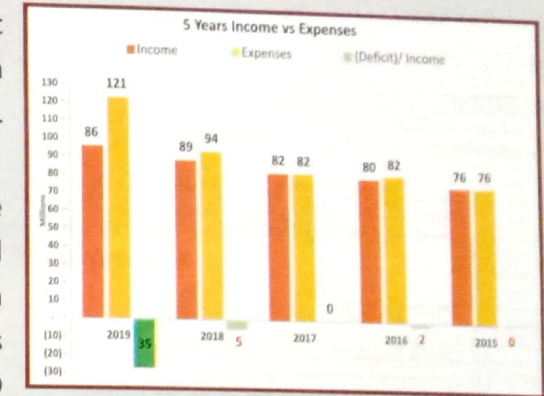
TREASURER'S REPORT

It is only by the efforts of the team, both employees and volunteers, that PWA has grown from a single cabinet of drugs into the largest student run NGO with an operating budget of 120 million.

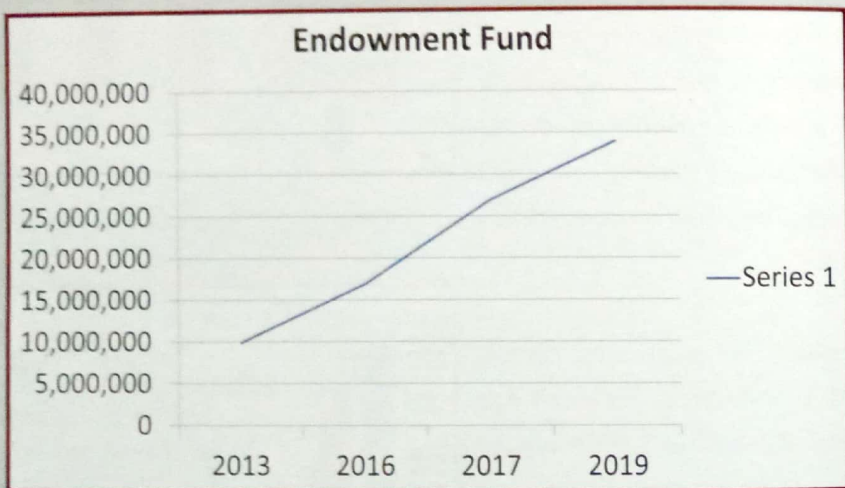
This year the expenses of our Blood Transfusion Services lies around 82 million, seeing an increase of about 30%. Our Thalassemia Services saw a rise of 25%, its expenses lie at 25 million.

Since its inception in 1979, PWA has always did its best to provide quality services to health care. For this purpose, we have separate departments to maintain the orderly operation of the organization. We also have separate Zakat and Donation accounts under Shariah Compliant system for purely



management of our finances under the advices of a Mufti from Darul Ifta Karachi.

The Endowment fund started in 2013 by the philanthropic support from the batch of 1988 of 10 million PKR. Since then it has grown by the support from the batches of 2002 and 1987. This year 500,000 were contributed by the batch of 1988 for endowment purposes. The profit generated from the endowment account was around 2.4 million.



Every year we put our efforts towards the betterment of the organization in hope that the ailing masses of our country might have a chance to live a healthy life which they cannot afford.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE ASSOCIATION

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **PATIENTS' WELFARE ASSOCIATION (DOW MEDICAL COLLEGE & CIVIL HOSPITAL), KARACHI** (the Association) which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2019 and the statement of income and expenditure account, statement of cash flows and statement of changes in funds for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements gives a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association as at 30 June 2019, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Accounting Standard for Not for Profit Organisations (NPOs) as issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan (ICAP).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as applicable in Pakistan. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants as adopted by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan (the Code), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

The Association is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan, and for such internal control as the Association determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Association is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

1 STATUS AND NATURE OF OPERATIONS

Patients' Welfare Association (the Association) is a Social Welfare Organization carrying out welfare activities at Civil Hospital, Karachi. The Association was established in the year 1979. It is registered under Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 with Director of Social Welfare Govt. of Sindh vide Reg. DSW(S)/399 of 1981 dated 31 December 1981.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Accounting system and convention

The management of association has decided to adopt accrual basis of accounting for preparation of financial statements with effect from the year ended 30 June 2003. These accounts have been prepared under historical cost convention except as disclosed in the accounting policies herein below.

2.2 Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements are measured using the currency of primary economic environment in which the Association operates. The financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees, which is the Association's functional and presentation currency.

2.3 Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated into Pak Rupees using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange prevailing at the balance sheet date. Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the income and expenditure account.

2.4 Property, plant and equipment

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at written down value. Depreciation charge is based on the reducing balance method at the rates specified in note 3 to the financial statements. Depreciation on additions is charged from the month the asset is put into use, while on disposals, depreciation is charged up to the month the asset was in use.

Normal repairs and maintenance are charged to income as and when incurred. Major renewals and replacements are capitalized and the assets so replaced, if any, are retired.

Gains or losses on sale of fixed assets are included in income currently.

2.5 Stock

Stock held (including stock in transit) is valued at cost.

Donation in kind are recorded at their fair value at the date of donation.

2.6 Revenue recognition

Donations & Grants either in cash or in kind are recorded on receipts basis. All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor.

2.7 Capitalization of assets for capital expenditures
 Donation for capital expenditure received for a particular fixed asset is recognized as Income when said asset is available for use.

Founded by the students of Dow Medical College Karachi in 1979, it works on the purpose to facilitate patients of Civil Hospital Karachi. PWA is being run entirely by the students of Dow Medical College in the premises of Civil Hospital Karachi.

The services provided by PWA are as following:

BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICES

PWA Voluntary Blood Bank was established in 1982 and it is registered by Sindh Blood Transfusion Authority (SBTA). On daily basis PWA dispatches more than 250 units of packed cells, fresh frozen plasma and platelets on either exchange basis or without donors in emergency, completely FREE OF COST. Here at PWA we ensure the provision of screened blood bags, free of blood borne diseases through an advanced technology CLIA which screens the blood, ensuring the health of patients.

THALASSEMIA SERVICES

Thalassemia is a blood disorder that can be inherited by a child from his parents. Children with this disease need regular blood transfusions and medications as well. This department of PWA was established back in 2011 and it provides regular blood transfusions and medicines to more than 250 registered thalassemic patients, under the supervision of qualified hematologist, completely free of cost.

In the past years, PWA has reached to a great height with the constant support of our well wishers. We are looking forward for the same response from our well wishers so that PWA can work for the sake of humanity more effectively.

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BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICES

Over 41 years of its legacy, the department of Blood Transfusion Services has proved to be one of the integral and elemental services provided by PWA. It has emerged as the largest single unit blood bank run by students of Dow Medical College in Karachi. PWA blood bank is registered with Sindh Blood Transfusion Authority (SBTA) and has been catering more than 250 blood bags throughout the city on exchange basis ensuring that each bag is completely screened and a that FREE OF COST.

PWAs blood bank divides the blood in three components namely packed cells, frozen plasma (FFP) and platelets. In correspondence to the WHO guidelines, every blood bag drawn is completely screened through five parameters: HIV/AIDS, Syphilis, Malaria and Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C.

Moreover, to keep itself updated with the latest advancements in technology and regulations, PWA has been a part of seminars and conferences organized by Sindh Blood Transfusion Authority (SBTA) and Safe Blood Transfusion Pakistan (SBTP). This year we shifted to tube grouping and one tube crossmatch with separate benches.

PWA has always aspired for the provision of high quality and disease-free blood to the needy and have strived to achieve this cause in every way possible. PWAs volunteers try to spread awareness about voluntary blood donations and for this purpose we regularly arrange blood donation and awareness camps in different colleges, universities, offices, companies and conferences throughout the city. PWA is extremely thankful for all your continuous and immeasurable support without which we would never have reached these remarkable heights and wish hope that your support remains forever.

Patients' Welfare Association expanded its services in 2011 by establishing Thalassemia Day Care Centre (TDC) with the aim of providing quality management to thalassemia patients and it aspires to uplift these miserable souls. PWA Thalassemia Day Care Centre was inaugurated as a "Public Private Partnership" between PWA and Government of Sindh.

Currently, the department of Thalassemia Services is serving around 250 registered patients, providing them safe and screened blood, iron chelation therapy, required medications, transfusion services and routine laboratory investigations completely free of cost under the supervision of qualified consultant hematologist, medical officer and trained nurses.

To ensure that every patient receives complete quality care, PWA has launched a campaign "Sponsor A Thalassaemic (SAT)" to meet the monetary needs required for the management of these thalassemia patients. The sponsorship costs around Rs.3,00,000-4,00,000 per patient per annum. RECORDS AND REGISTRATIONS

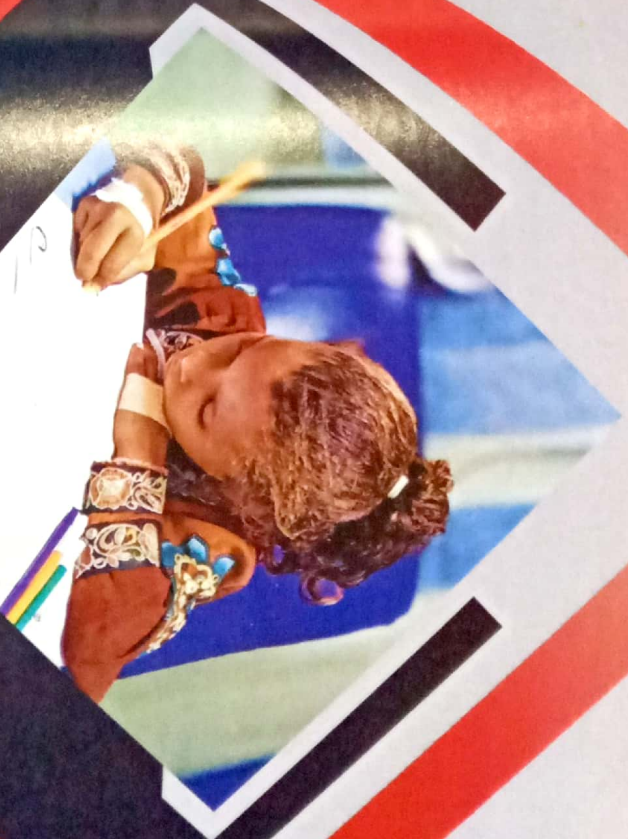
In PWA, we maintain the monthly records of all departments in order to monitor the progress of our working departments which helps our donors and well-wishers to stay committed to our course of actions. P In the department of Thalassemia services, regular records of the registered patients were maintained along with their blood transfusions, medications and laboratory analysis.

W In the department of Blood Transfusion services, a complete record of screening was maintained and the donors who were seropositive for Hepatitis B/ Hepatitis C/ Syphilis/ Malaria/ HIV were informed, followed by proper counseling. Moreover, the record of input and output of our voluntary blood bank has been fully computerized and is being maintained regularly.

We pay our genuine gratitude to TCS for supporting and helping us in delivering our cause to the community. The organisation is handling two major departments under its domain- namely the blood transfusion services and thalassemia services. All services provided here are completely free of cost. The daily output of blood bank varies from 200-250 pints of blood. The number of registered thalassemic children is around 250. They are provided free blood transfusions under supervision of the consultant haematologist and given chelating agents and supporting medicines.
