





## HOW IT ALL BEGAN: OUR JOURNEY

Over four decades ago, three students at Dow Medical College saw a lack of quality services and support for the underprivileged patients seeking medical treatment at Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital, Karachi. Eager to change things for the better, they decided to establish an organization dedicated to serve the needy in their hardest times with no compromise and no cost. From these humble beginnings, Patients' Welfare Association (PWA) did nothing but grow. Hundreds of volunteers, through their experiences with PWA, learned compassion and PWA's "We Feel, We Serve" attitude. Countless supporters rose up to contribute to PWA when they saw the sheer hard work of the volunteers and the exponential effects PWA had on the patients of Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital, Karachi. PWA paved the way for accessible medicines, diagnostic tests and T.B follow up in Civil Hospital and is currently serving the patients through its Blood Transfusion Services and Thalassemia Services.

# AN INSIGHT INTO PWA

Patients' Welfare Association is registered under the Sindh Welfare Department (Registration No. DSW (s) 399 of 1981) as a non-profit, non-political organization.

Founded by the three students of Dow Medical College in 1979, PWA's sole aim was to serve the underprivileged patients with quality care treatments. As we feel their pain, we try our level best to serve them the facilities that they are deprived of.

Since then this organization has been actively serving patients on the premises of Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital, Karachi and is continuously growing to benefit humanity. PWA has been providing services to the underprivileged patients **FREE OF COST.** 

Beyond these terms, PWA consists of a tight-knit, passionate group of students carrying the same sentiments as those that founded it. Through their journey as PWA volunteers, they learn the beauty of working simply for the betterment of other human beings and come out of PWA with a greater sense of empathy and responsibility. PWA is proud to equip future doctors with an indescribable love for humanity- an underrated skill that makes a good doctor a great oneall the while making a real difference in the community around them.

## BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICES

It is both technically and figuratively correct to say that the blood bank is the heart that pumps life to Patients' Welfare Association. The origins of the founding of the blood bank go back to the 1980s, when most blood donors were homeless drug addicts. Their blood contribution was enough to sustain life, but the samples were unscreened, unsafe, and uncertain. Realizing that the patients' lives were at risk, a blood provision centre was established by PWA, where the providers would not have to yield to any pressure of finances and infections. Owing to this, a blood bank was founded in the year 1982.

The department of Blood Transfusion Services is registered with Sindh Blood Transfusion Authority (SBTA) and provides around 200-250 units of screened blood products per day, completely FREE OF COST.

PWA knew the task of providing blood to those in need comes with the responsibility of having it available in abundance and being truly safe. Thus, we take steps to ensure that the blood provided is free of all transmissible diseases and harmful substances, and is transfused to guarantee sanitary measures and safety of all the people involved. The blood obtained from donors is screened for five parameters according to WHO's guidelines: HIV, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, Malaria, and Syphilis. The intent is achieved through microscopy and Chemiluminescent Immunoassay (CLIA) machines.

In 2019, we started the Closed System method of blood collection in our Voluntary Blood Bank. This would mean greater sterility and longer shelf life of collected blood. A new bench has also been added at the bleeding area, to make the working more smooth and hassle free. Our inventory received proper maintenance and cultures of our blood products and check cells have been started from this year.

We are grateful to our benefactors for sponsoring the new sealers and stripers in PWA's Voluntary Blood Bank. Because of these supplies, we are able to streamline our procedures and thus, provide higher quality in less time.

From managing mass disasters to giving clean and adequate blood to every single patient, from regular transfusions of patients having blood disorders to providing blood requirements and surgeries, PWA's Voluntary Blood disorders to providing blood requirements and surgeries, PWA's Voluntary Blood Bank has been able to carry out these accomplishments because of the mutual efforts of both our donors and volunteers. Through various campaigns and donation drives, we have increased our voluntary blood donor pool and are grateful to every single one of them. We could never deny the aid of all the generous beings who have been our strength throughout and thank them for their efforts in leading PWA to the goal of providing safe and quality blood to everyone who needs it.

### THALASSEMIA SERVICES

Thalassemia is an inherited blood disorder in which the body makes an inadequate amount of normal-hemoglobin. This is a major health problem that also burdens families of those individuals with financial and emotional stress.

Patients' Welfare Association expanded its services in 2011 by establishing the Thalassemia Daycare Centre to provide quality management to thalassemia patients and aspiring to uplift those underprivileged families. PWA's Thalassemia Daycare Centre was inaugurated as a "Public-Private Partnership" between PWA and the Government of Sindh.

Currently, the Thalassemia Daycare Centre is catering the needs of **240** registered patients, providing them with safe and screened blood transfusions, iron chelation therapy, necessary medications, and routine laboratory investigations, completely **FREE OF COST.** These services are rendered under the supervision of qualified consultant hematologist, medical officers, and trained nurses.

"Sponsor a Thalassemic" (SAT) in order to meet the monetary needs required for the management of these thalassemia patients. The sponsorship costs range from Rs. 300,000/- to Rs. 500,000/- per patient, annually. We humbly request our donors and supporters to sponsor the annual expenses of these children and help us make their lives easier.

This year, PWA has signed a Letter of Agreement with The Health Foundation (THF). Both organizations have joined hands to spread awareness about Hepatitis. We have reached an agreement with THF that if any PWA thalassemia patient contracts hepatitis, they will be treated by THF in return for our efforts in the fight against Hepatitis.

Additionally, a Memorandum of Understanding between Afzal Memorial Thalassemia Foundation and Patients' Welfare Association was signed. AMTF has decided to provide Echocardiography and Ultrasound services to our thalassemia patients, free of cost, while we will cater to their demands for blood products through our Blood Bank.

These agreements have undoubtedly helped our organization expand and develop, and we hope to continue making such progress for the welfare of the thalassemia patients under our care.

We, here at the Department of Thalassemia Services, would like to extend a sincere and heartfelt thank-you to our great donors, philanthropists, and well-wishers for their continuous support. May Allah Almighty accept our efforts and help PWA continue its services and be the source of hope and happiness for humanity, Ameen.



# RECORDS AND REGISTRATIONS

The department of records and registrations is responsible for keeping monthly records of every department in order to track and oversee their progress.

The record of input and output of blood bags is regularly checked and maintained to ensure the working.

We are also immensely thankful to our supporters such as TCS for providing us with their complementary services and to i-Care Foundation Pakistan, who have made it easier for our international donors to donate to PWA - becoming an integral part of the Zakat Campaign as well as general fundraising.

The department of records and registrations would like to express our sincerest gratitude for the magnanimous support provided to us throughout the year, and we aim to see more prosperity in the future.

# ADMINISTRATION AND PLANNING

The department of Administration and Planning works to generate funds and promote Patients' Welfare Association on all platforms to ensure smooth working of the organization.

### EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Listed below are the events that occurred in the year 2020.

- On 8th January 2020, the new batch of **Dowites 2025 was welcomed** with great joy and warmth. An orientation was held followed by an extensive tour to introduce the newcomers to the working of PWA.
- Volunteers of PWA celebrated World Education Day on 24th January 2020, with the thalassemia patients registered at our Thalassemia Daycare Centre. The volunteers planned a short activity full of enjoyment and fun.
- PWA held its first media meetup on 8th Feburary 2020
- The PWA volunteers' enormous efforts showed their bright colours on **Bakesale** day on 15th February 2020. Our chief guest for the event was Dr. Amanullah Kasim, Chairman All Pakistan Textile Mill Association. His presence added to the success of the event along with others.
- On 23rd February, 2020 'Healing Souls' joined hands with PWA and visited TDC to spend time with the thalassemia patients.
- MoU was signed between PWA and Khaskheli Tanzeem for the promotion of voluntary blood camps.
- Street Kitchen partnered with PWA; allowing 20% of their proceedings to be dedicated to our cause.
- On 9th March 2020, PWA held a meeting with the honorable philanthropist chairman of the AKD group **Mr. Aqeel Karim Dhedhi.**
- On 14th March 2020, in collaboration with **Denim Prive**, PWA conducted a voluntary **blood camp**. We received an astonishing response from the donors.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF ZAKAT CAMPAIGN 2020

Zakat Campaign, one of the most crucial events of PWA, which lasted from

15th March till 1st June 2020, became a huge success with an overwhelming response from around the globe.

- On 23rd March 2020, PWA collaborated with 'House of Ladies' on 'Be Kind Social Media Campaign' to spread the message of kindness and compassion.
- On 21st April 2020, PWA reached another milestone by launching the 'Share Hope' campaign. The campaign received an overwhelmingly positive response from the audience. Candidates who were selected for the campaign participated eagerly from spreading our message to collecting donations for our thalassemia patients.
- On 25th April 2020, volunteers of PWA presented our organization on News One and TV One Ramzan Transmission.
- On 19th May 2020, volunteers of PWA yet again demonstrated their diligent spirits by conveying the spirits of our organization on **Geo Pakistan**.

- HBL Foundation, under their CSR project, installed a refrigerator in our blood bank.

- Showing their continued support, DOW batch of 1994, installed a cryofuge at our blood bank.
- To brighten the smiles of our TDC kids, the volunteers celebrated **Eid ul Azha** with them by distributing gifts.
- On 12th August 2020, volunteers of PWA went live with **Dr Abdul Rahman** (one of the founders of PWA) on account of **International Youth Day**. Dr Abdul Rahman advised the youth with his golden words on managing time and staying organized.
- On 14th August 2020, volunteers of PWA celebrated **Independence Day** with our TDC kids with great spirit of patriotism and freedom by reciting national anthems and cutting a cake afterwards.
- Starting from 24th August 2020, PWA held a creative online competition called 'Quaran-tribution'. This healthy competition gave a chance to all of the skilled people, quarantined, to bring out their skill and art and share it with everyone.
- To keep our respected donors and alumni in loop, we started sending out regular messages and e-mails.
- On 2nd September online session on Thalassemia prevention and awareness and COVID pandemic.

Likewise, an awareness session for the volunteers of Takhtee was also held on 7th November 2020.
- On 8th November 2020, Sunday, a collaboration webinar with VFAHT took place via Google Meet. The webinar highlighted the Importance of the Screening of Blood and Hepatitis Awareness.
- We also celebrated World Children's Day, on 21st November 2020, by going live on our Facebook page from PWA's Thalassemia Daycare Centre, - "A Day with Thalassemia Warriors"
- Officials from Walmart visited PWA.
- Volunteers of PWA had a meeting with CEO of Tata Industries Shahid
   Answer Tata.
- On 28th November 2020, our 39th **Annual General Body Meeting** was held via zoom. We presented our audit 2018–2019 to our generous donors, our alumni from around the globe and respected guests. Mr. Shariq Vohra, President Karachi Chambers of Commerce and Industries, was the Chief Guest of the event.
- To lighten the mood in our Thalassemia Daycare Center and make it more beautiful, **Nelson Paints** under the **CSR project** painted both the halls with beautiful wall art.

- On 5th December 2020, on account of **International Volunteer Day**, the dedicated members of PWA went live on our Facebook page to celebrate the spirit of volunteerism.
- On 8th December 2020, Tuesday, Patients' Welfare Association conducted a 2-hour Webinar **PLENTY REDS** on the Importance of blood donation and the Blood Transmissible Diseases via Zoom.
- On the 22nd of December 2020, Tuesday, Patients' Welfare Association conducted a 2-hour Webinar- **NO MORE THALASSEMIA** on Thalassemia awareness via zoom.
- On 28th of December 2020, Patients' Welfare Association hosted an online live session on the **2nd wave of Covid-19 and its effect on mental health.**
- Blood donation is a constant need in our society. To create emphasis on blood donation and blood transmissible diseases, PWA held various sessions for students belonging to different institutes.




### TREASURER'S REPORT

By the grace of Allah Almighty, Patients' Welfare Association presents the Audited Financial Report for the fiscal year 2019-20.

In the past 42 years PWA has grown into the largest student run non-governmental, non-political organization by the efforts of enthusiastic volunteers, hardworking employees and continuous support of our generous donors and well wishers.


In the year 2019–20, our annual expenses amount to 118M. Expenses of Blood Transfusion Services have reached 76M, where as Thalassemia Services 27.7M. The current pandemic situation had decreased the need of blood for elective surgeries hence, less requirement of blood in hospitals that eventually caused a slight decline in Blood Transfusion Services expenditure.



Various campaigns were run by the volunteers to maintain the inflow of donations. Around 68.6M were generated in Zakat Campaign 2019. Fund raising activities were arranged, like the Mega fund-raising event - Bakesale.

Endowment fund was initiated in 2013, which has grown with support of our donors and Dowites from various batches. In year 2019–2020 the total Endowment fund

was around 27M, due to the increasing liabilities and the financial instability of the organization it was decided to breakdown the Endowment certificates to pay off the liability. Currently our Endowment Fund is around 10M. Hopefully in the near future we will achieve all the targets.




PWA is a Shariah Compliant organization affiliated with Darul Uloom Darul Ifta Karachi, through which we make sure that your Zakat and donation reaches the deserving patients.

Recently, we received Grant in Aid from the Health Department of Sindh to pay off our liabilities. We also received funds from Zakat and Usher Department Sindh. We have signed an agreement letter with Binder Dijker Otte & Co (BDO) audit firm, who will perform the audit for the fiscal year 2020–21.

The detailed audited financial reports of the year 2019-20 are attached further which reflects selfless dedication of our volunteers and staff members.

### Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements



# PATIENTS' WELFARE ASSOCIATION (DOW MEDICAL COLLEGE & CIVIL HOSPITAL) NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

### STATUS AND NATURE OF OPERATIONS

Patients' Welfare Association (the Association) is a Social Welfare Organization carrying out welfare activities at Civil Hospital, Karachi. The Association was established in the year 1979. It is registered under Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 with Director of Social Welfare Govt. of Sindh vide Reg. DSW(S)/399 of 1981 dated 31 December 1981.

### 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### 2.1 Accounting system and convention

The management of association has decided to adopt accrual basis of accounting for preparation of financial statements with effect from the year ended 30 June 2003.

These accounts have been prepared under historical cost convention except as disclosed in the accounting policies herein below.

### 2.2 Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements are measured using the currency of primary economic environment in which the Association operates. The financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees, which is the Association's functional and presentation currency.

### 2.3 Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated into Pak Rupees using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange prevailing at the balance sheet date. Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the income and expenditure account.

### 2.4 Property, plant and equipment

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at written down value. Depreciation charge is based on the reducing balance method at the rates specified in note 3 to the financial statements. Depreciation on additions is charged from the month the asset is put into use, while on disposals, depreciation is charged up to the month the asset was in use.

Normal repairs and maintenance are charged to income as and when incurred. Major renewals and replacements are capitalized and the assets so replaced, if any, are retired.

Gains or losses on sale of fixed assets are included in income currently.

### 2.5 Stock

Stock held (including stock in transit) is valued at cost.

Donation in kinds are recorded at their fair value at the date of donation.

### 2.6 Revenue recognition

Donations & Grants either in cash or in kind are recorded on receipts basis. All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor.

#### Capitalization of reserve for capital expenditure

Donation for capital expenditure received for a particular fixed asset is recognized as Income when said asset is available for use.

#### Funds 2.8

#### Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds represents resources over which the association has discretionary control and are available for the various programs and administration of the association.

#### Restricted funds

Restricted funds represents resources subject to donor imposed restrictions.

Any surplus remaining in restricted funds is transferred to unrestricted funds, if permitted by the donors or agreement between the association and the donor(s).
